

Teacher practices that emphasize the value and practice of learning convey messages of growth, potential, and high expectations to students.



Skill. Teach strategies for successfully taking on challenging tasks that extend the frontiers of students' current ability.



Resilience. Create a culture of high expectations and safety that enables students to be resilient academic risk takers.

Help students understand and manage emotional reactions that emerge when learning and challenging themselves.

Show confidence students will meet high standards with the right work and support.

Make it safe to take risks Make challenging oneself the norm; let students gain confidence by working through tasks just outside their comfort zone.

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Teach students how to support each other in taking academic risks and celebrating mistakes as learning opportunities.

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Tell the truth about where students currently are and where they need to be, but be mindful to avoid sending messages about ranking and comparisons. Explain that tests are not an absolute measure of ability; teach students how to use them to identify areas for growth and learn from mistakes.

Encourage students to revise their work so they can practice and demonstrate increased mastery.
